



## Naming Emotions – Level Two

### Learning objective

For the child to complete a sentence with a single word description of an emotion.

- The child could use symbols to answer the cloze exercises. Symbols are not provided so the adult will need to ensure that the appropriate symbols are available to the child before starting the activity.

### Activity

This activity uses cloze exercises – sentences where the child has to fill in missing words – based on The Transporters episodes. The exercises are divided into easy and hard. In the easy exercises, the child has two potential answers. In the hard exercises, the child has three potential answers. In both cases, the correct answer is highlighted in bold.



### **Instructions**

- Print out the activity sheets you wish to use.
- Show the child the corresponding episode of The Transporters.
- Discuss the events of the episode with the child, using the episode synopses on pages 10-23 of the User's Guide if necessary.
- Read the first sentence of the cloze exercises relating to the episode the child has just watched, leaving out the missing word. Depending on the ability of the child, offer them two or three options as the correct missing word.

### **Ability requirements**

This activity is primarily expressive. The child needs to be able to complete a series of sentences relating to a specific episode of The Transporters.
